- Identify available baseline data and additional data points that would be useful for measuring task force impact and work with institutions to develop a system for collecting, analyzing, and implementing that data-driven change.
  - Assist community and institutional leaders in evaluating how bias impacts their organizations, including in recruiting and hiring diverse workforces, and support them in developing policies and practices for preventing it.
  - Engage the community by actively seeking input to address issues and implement solutions, including providing safe mediums to receive community input and experiences.
  - Host opportunities for people to learn about bias, interact with others who are different from themselves, and find common ground.
  - Audit each system for accessibility to information in different languages, format, and delivery methods and ensure residents have meaningful access to essential information in their own language.
  - Identify and remove barriers to participation for marginalized community members on local boards and commissions and in other volunteer and business leadership positions.

### Crowdsourced Ideas of How to Support Leaders of Color and Racial Justice Work

- Share resource lists.
- Spending the time to educate yourself and listen.
- Recognize, have conversations in our communities and in our workplaces. Try to have the conversations without fear, with an open mind. Be empathetic and acknowledge the struggle.

- Standing up and saying something rather than avoiding stepping on toes. Bringing folks in and having conversations early on. Sit down at the table with each other to speak about similarities.
- Put trust into new people's communication approaches.
- Start a Showing Up for Racial Justice (SURJ) Chapter.
- Engage in advocacy that addresses systemic racism.
- Support black owned businesses in our communities.
- Supporting community organizations and collaborating with organizations that focus on business owners of color.
- General operating support from foundations.
- Talk to partners and grantees about the kinds of diversity training they are doing.
- Donate hours of administrative support to help people of color work through complex paperwork.
- Put a budget line item in for internal diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) work - commit to funding it.
- Training and monetary support for organizations to offer service and training to staff and community members around racial justice, inclusion, diversity.
- Hire diverse board members and staff.
- Conduct focus groups with people of color.
